**NOTICE OF REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF AN AMENDMENT TO AN
INTERCONNECTION AGREEMENT UNDER THE TELECOMMUNICATIONS
ACT OF 1996**

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that on March 13, 2009, Verizon Delaware LLC (“Verizon”), f/k/a Verizon Delaware Inc., and Eureka Telecom, Inc. d/b/a Eureka Networks (“Eureka”), filed a joint application asking the Public Service Commission to approve a negotiated supplemental Amendment No. 2 to the Interconnection Agreement between Verizon and Eureka. This Amendment added new provisions to the original agreement, which was submitted to the Commission on December 13, 2005. The original agreement was approved by the Commission by PSC Order No. 6820 on January 24, 2006.

Provisions in the submitted amendment include:

- Preconditions which include, in part, Eureka’s agreement not to oppose Verizon’s right to bill retrospectively or to limit billing claims in accordance with the terms of this amendment.
- Certain limitations for “Backbill Amounts” including the agreement that the billed party shall not be liable for Backbill Amounts if such Backbill Amounts

were incurred earlier than twelve (12) months prior to the date of the invoice including such backbilled charges.

- The agreement that Verizon and Eureka shall submit to the other party on a monthly basis an itemized statement of charges incurred by the other party during the preceding month (except in the case of non-usage sensitive charges which will be billed in the forthcoming month).
- Provisions for procedures to handle billing disputes which include that the party billed shall give written notice to the billing party of the amounts it disputes through the billing party's claims submission process. The notice shall provide details and reasons for each disputed charge.
- A one-and-one-half percent (1.5%) late payment charge.

Copies of the amendment are available for public inspection and copying at the Commission's office at the address set out below during normal business hours.

Under Guidelines 30 & 31 of the Commission's Guidelines for Negotiations, Mediations, Arbitration, and Approval of Agreements Between Local Exchange Telecommunications Carriers, any interested person may submit written comments and any supporting material concerning the Commission's approval or rejection of the Verizon and Eureka amendment. Comments should focus on the criteria for review set forth in 47 U.S.C. §§ 252(e)(2)(A) and whether the agreement as amended is consistent with applicable state law, regulation, or policy. Such comments must be filed with the Commission and served upon Verizon and Eureka. **COMMENTS MUST BE FILED WITH THE COMMISSION AND SERVED UPON VERIZON AND EUREKA ON OR BEFORE APRIL 13, 2009. ONLY PERSONS WHO SUBMIT COMMENTS WILL RECEIVE NOTICE OF ANY FURTHER PROCEEDINGS IN THIS MATTER.** Filing

and service may be made by facsimile transmission followed by mail or express delivery.

The Commission will approve or reject the agreement on or before June 11, 2009.
